The Irish Synodal Pathway – The Journey So Far

When a major initiative is discussed for years, people
naturally begin to wonder if anything is happening and
can feel disconnected. In 2021 and 2022, the synodal
journey started at our parish doors when thousands of
people across Ireland participated, through a local
consultation process, in sharing perspectives about
what was working and what was broken in the Church.
Those local conversations became diocesan reports,
which helped shape global input. Last autumn,
delegates from every Irish diocese met in Kilkenny to
propose specific national priorities based on that
